Greetings from quarantine. We are nearly finished – the end is in sight!

We were wondering if anyone would like to join us for a Zoom afternoon tea or evening coffee again. If you, or anyone from your church, would like to join us on **Monday 10**th **May 3-4pm** or **Wednesday 12**th **7.30-8.30pm** please let us know and we'll send out a Zoom meeting link. It will be great to catch up with people again.

We ask you to continue to remember in prayer the Covid situation in Nepal. Daily case numbers and deaths are shooting up. The number of new daily cases has increased tenfold in a couple of weeks. Already the health system is struggling to cope with the number of people that need inpatient care and ventilators. A vaccination programme had started but is slowing down because of lack of supplies and poor organisation. People are scared. We rejoice that things are so much better here in the UK but the picture is very bleak in much of South Asia – India, Bangladesh, Nepal and Sri Lanka especially.

Join us in prayer for India - News from Open Doors

As you have probably seen, Covid-19 is on the rise in India with devastating consequences. A few days ago the number of new Coronavirus infections in the country passed 20 million. The health system is strained, hospitals are over capacity, and many are suffering without sufficient treatment.

Open Doors partners, volunteers, and their families have also been affected - some are in critical condition and a few have sadly passed away. Brother Solomon*, an Open Doors Partner shared:

"The virus has been spreading rapidly in the rural areas like small towns and villages where the medical facilities are almost negligible - this can lead to high mortality rates in these areas. Most of our community people are concentrated in these areas, therefore their lives are more vulnerable.

We really praise God and thank all who are praying for India, around 12 of our partners and family members have recovered from COVID. (But) around 35 of the partners and family members are still recovering from COVID and two of them are on oxygen support."

Please join us in praying for our brothers and sisters in India:

- Pray for the Lord's healing, peace, and comfort to be with all those who are ill or who
 are grieving lost loved ones.
- Pray for the Lord to sustain India's hospitals and to provide sufficient supply of the necessary medicines, ventilators, and oxygen.
- Pray for Open Doors partners in India who are in good health, as they continue to minister to those who have been greatly affected by the lockdowns and are living with meagre food and resources.
