NEWS FROM MATT FROMM

Matt Fromm says: please keep praying for the Christian Union (CU) at Lincoln University where I am studying. We are planning to send a letter to the Churches in Lincoln that are supporting us, as well as our home Churches, outlining some specific prayer requests, so hopefully WBC should receive one soon. In the meantime, prayer for normal CU nights (Tuesdays), and the prayer meeting, band practice and the two cell groups we have that go on each week would be greatly appreciated.

A bit of information about my trip in the summer: I am going to Durban in South Africa with an organisation called **Soul in the City** which is part of **Soul Survivor** (find out more here www.soulinthecitydurban.com). I am going from the **5 - 20 July** and will be working as part of a nine person team on a completely new project which they haven't run before. We will be working with a lady called Lauren Matthews in an HIV/AIDS clinic and a crèche. However, our main task is to renovate a Methodist Church. Lauren is going to bring together three youth groups - a black, a coloured and a white youth group - to do the renovating with us and we are to try to encourage friendships etc. This has never been done before in South Africa and the divisions between the different racial groups are still vast so this should be very exciting.
