GIVE PRAISE, THANKS & PRAYER

BMS World Mission workers Graeme and Jenny Riddell are serving with BMS partner, the Baptist Union of Uganda (BUU), in the west of the country. Graeme formerly worked as a geography teacher and Jenny as a solicitor. They are now involved in educational and legal work, seeking to improve the lives of many disadvantaged people, especially women and children. Pray that the Lord gives wisdom and discernment.

Surviving Pastor Kamasa fled the fighting in Congo with his family 12 years ago. Today he lives in a Kyangwali refugee settlement, no more than a sprawling mass of UNHCR plastic-sheeted dwellings on a plot of land 50 by 100 feet, where most have constructed mud huts and attempt to grow their own food. They are among thousands of other Sudanese and Congolese long-term refugees waiting for an opportunity to go home.

Life as a refugee at Kyangwali is not all a rosy picture as evidenced by the difficult questions being asked during a recent seminar on refugee law - *"How can I get a pass to leave the camps?" "Why is it that a man who defiled a girl some weeks ago is now walking free around the camp?" "Who will inherit my property back in Congo if I die in Uganda?"* Pray for encouragement and a breakthrough.
