NEWS FROM BMS WORLD MISSION & TEARFUND

BABY LOVE

Mission workers Fiona and Les Allan work in Bangladesh at the Christian Hospital Chandraghona. Fiona works in nutrition and health promotion and Les is providing administrative support to the hospital's director.

In a report on the BMS website they tell us about the important developments in antenatal care for the poor with whom they are working. In a country famous for its large population and high birth rate, it is ironic that so many women have little or no access to antenatal services.

The ultrasound scans and check-ups that we take for granted in the UK are a luxury that many families cannot afford. Ongoing support from midwives and health visitors is non-existent. It is no surprise therefore, that Bangladesh has high death and sickness rates for both mothers and young children. However, hospital staff demonstrate the practical love of Jesus by improving these services to the poorest in society through its community health programme (CHP). New reports from near the conflict zone reveal the indiscriminate nature of the fighting and heavy toll being paid by the civilian population. Youngsters fleeing fighting are not only going without food and water but some are dying from appalling injuries. Tearfund partner World Concern, which has been helping people at a hospital in the northern town of Trincomalee, has seen people injured by mortar shelling and other heavy weapons. One World Concern staff member reported how a family of five spent two days in a bunker to escape shelling'.

PRAY That God will help these people to overcome this dreadful adversity and enter a time of peace and plenty with His help.
