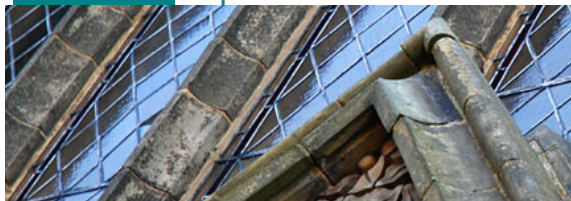

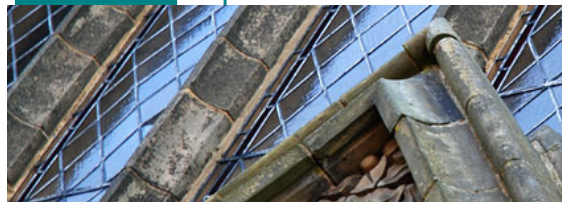

Nicaragua is one of eight countries taking part in the tournament in Durban, which aims to raise the issue of street children in a major way and advocate for their basic rights.

Aside from the football, which runs throughout the week-long event, there will also be art workshops, interaction with local schools and presentations. BMS worker Dan Pratt will be involved in outreach with local Baptist churches.

The Nicaragua team comprises boys and girls helped by BMS' partner Casa Alianza. Teenagers like Wendy (*below*), who used to take drugs on the streets of the capital, Managua. Today she is studying, with the dream of becoming a lawyer.
