On Monday 51 children joined us in the hall with their grown-ups. Between playing and singing they managed to get a bit of banana - some of them had two or three! - and most of them had fun sticking cotton wool onto a cloud shape. We gave the children the option of taking their cloud home, or sticking it onto our Noah's Ark Story banner - which we're forming by recycling the banner we used to announce the church's services last Christmas! We were pleased to notice that none of the children insisted on taking their cloud with them, but instead all of them enjoyed contributing to our scene. We also had fishes to stick, but limited water scene, so we happily let the kiddies put their fish wherever they liked, including in the mud and the grass! The activity was so popular that eight feet of banner isn't long enough, so we're busy figuring out a way to extend it so they can all contribute to the rainbow next week, when we will also be making springy snakes!

We have a very short list of emergency helpers who admirably step up when our reliable team is struck by car trouble, migraine, or other hazards life may throw us... If you could be free for us to very occasionally ring you at the last minute, we would be very grateful. Hosting 100+ emotional people (children but sometimes mummies too!) for an hour and a half a week is a huge achievement, and it gives us a ministry opportunity like many churches never see. You don't even have to play with the children - there are dads, granddads, and grannies there as well, all of whom may just need someone to talk to. If you have never got involved and would be willing to go on-call for us, we would be very grateful, and we know you would feel blessed by contributing.
