Monday 10:00am Wymondham Baptist Church, Queen Street

At Little Acorns on Monday we tried story time for the first time. This is something I've been wanting to try, but I wasn't quite sure how to make it happen amongst all the existing activities, responsibilities, and volunteer structure.

At 9:30 Michael and Shirley arrived, him carrying a large cushion, and they made themselves quickly at home. I went round the hall telling everyone that we had a 'real live Granddad' in the lounge, planning to read stories at 10:30. There are a few teething problems to work out, particularly around reading over the noise that 49 children and their grown-ups make, but we found straight away that some of the families appreciated and took the opportunity to sit and be still in a quieter group.

On Monday we will be making and decorating shakers by filling 500ml drink bottles with lentils, pasta, and beans. This is an activity that the children love every year, and we find they keep them amongst their toys for a very long time. Thank you to those who have brought bottles in to help us collect enough for all the children to participate. I love looking at the excitement and mayhem that Little Acorns can appear to be, and knowing just how many people amongst the church have contributed to making it happen. When people of all ages in the church reach out to the families of all ages that come to Acorns, it becomes the start of a ministry of the whole church family, to the whole community family. Something very special indeed.
